<b>Dryden Youth Services</b> (offered by Cornell Cooperative Extension)	One full-time program manager offers a variety of programs such as outdoor education, cooking, gardening, animal care, employment skills, environmental awareness, music and the arts, community service. Participants gain social and team skills, independence, confidence and self-esteem. Free.
Who:	Dryden middle- and high-school aged youth; primary focus on middle schoolers who do not typically participate in or succeed at school or in community clubs, activities, sports and programs and welcoming all others so balanced groups are achieved where diverse youth can feel a sense of belonging.
Where:	Dryden Middle School and other locations
When:	Year round; after school, evenings, weekends, some in-school. Themed daytime weekly programs offered in the summer.

Where:	Most programming takes places at 4H Acres; transportation is provided for youth residing at Hanshaw Village, Beaconview and Congers Mobile Home Parks.
When:	Year round, 4 days/week
